FOR Excellent sound quality; stunning build and design dedicated app stunning build and design

You don't get many all-in-one syst of this calibre. The Ruark R2 Mk3 system, now in its third iteration,

remains a staunch favourite here at What Hi-Fi? It's not just that it's well designed, nor that it has an impressive set of features lurking beneath that sleek chassis. It's because the R2 Mk3 is a gorgeous-looking system packed w streaming features – and it also delivers an effortlessly musical played side by side, the Ruark's sound comes across as a smidge insubstantial. Then again, the Ruark doesn't struggle with its treble as the Revo does. If subso does a better job playing in smaller rooms, never sounding overblown or imbalanced. We also admire the Ruark's delicacy with textures, which demonstrates a level of dexterity the Revo is incapable of.

holds onto its spot as our favourite all-in-one system thanks to its lower price and superior audio performance. The Ruark R2 Mk3 is a gorgeous-looking machine that will fit into any home, and that lush, punchy sound is just so much fun to listen to. We want one for ourselves.
